The investment of \$154 million spawned a spate of development activity in the 22-square-mile area that has seen rough times. The centerpiece is the Chase Near Eastside Community Center, but a partial list of other projects includes more than 397 homes or apartments built, rehabilitated or repaired; 24 new or fully rehabilitated homes for sale in St. Clair Place Neighborhood; five planned development projects, including Clifford Corners, a mixed-use project; eight new retail businesses; technical assistance to 67 businesses; and more than 2,000 trees planted.

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
