Lilly Endowment announces recipients of National Clergy Renewal Program awards

Some are going to Europe, others to Africa. Some will visit urban churches in the United States. Others will take the back roads of small-town USA. Some will unleash their creative impulses – write poetry, play an instrument, paint. Many will go on spiritual retreats. Still others will explore historic places within their particular religious traditions. All will share the experience of having the time simply to stop, step back, reflect and renew themselves and their spirits.

“They” are the 127 pastors representing 123 congregations (there are four clergy couples in the group) that are sending them on three- to four-month sabbaticals through the National Clergy Renewal Program funded by Indianapolis-based Lilly Endowment Inc.

“Many people just do not realize that part of a pastor’s calling, part of his or her ‘job description,’ is to be spiritually growing all the time. Periodically, that requires an extended Sabbath – time away from the press of one’s usual responsibilities,” said Craig Dykstra, Endowment senior vice president for religion. “They write and preach sermons; they also make

hospital visits, administer the ‘business’ of their churches, preside at weddings and funerals, and counsel parishioners. And they are expected to ‘be there,’ to be available at both the best and the worst times in people’s lives.

“That’s where this clergy renewal program steps in. It provides pastors the opportunity to work alongside their congregations to plan an intentional time away to do what will ‘make their hearts sing,’” he continued. “Pastors cherish the chance to spend more time with their families, travel to places that may be new to them, pursue scholarly interests, enjoy nature, go on spiritual retreats, meet interesting people – and return home with the renewed energy, vigor and fresh outlook that can make a big difference in their pastorates and their congregations.”

Since 2000 the Endowment has awarded 881 national clergy renewal grants in 48 states across the country to Christian congregations whose pastors have earned a master of divinity degree. (The Endowment administers a separate program for Indiana congregations.) This year’s recipients represent 19 denominations and lead churches in 37 states and the District of Columbia. Their budgets run the gamut from nearly \$76,000 to almost \$7.5 million, and their worship attendance ranges from about 20 to 3,500.

Each congregation may apply for an award of up to \$45,000, and up to \$15,000 of that amount may be spent for congregational support during the absence of the pastor.

The congregation of Grace Episcopal Church in Amherst, Mass., says that the chance for its pastor to write poetry and paint, have time for renewal for his young family and reestablish healthy habits around work and recreation is what will make his heart sing.

He is the Rev. A. Robert Hirschfeld. He and his family – wife and three youngsters – have never traveled outside the country. Soon they will head for Italy for two weeks of exploration in Rome, Florence and Venice, soaking in the museums, churches, galleries and paintings. Then Hirschfeld will attend the Iowa Summer Writing Festival and an art workshop in Taos, N. Mex., and set up a studio in which to paint and write. He also will visit with old friends and family.

His congregation claims that this renewal program is a chance for the whole congregation to deepen their relationship with God through a variety of artistic activities.

Congregants claim the church is “teeming with talent and energy. Among us are painters, novelists, poets, short story authors, musicians, dancers and actors, and all sorts of artists.” They even have a Liturgical Arts Camp program for the youth. Grace sees this as a “wonderful opportunity for all of us to explore how Christ is the means by which God continuously recreates, restores, heals and ‘makes all things new.’”

Not far away, in the heart of the African American community of Boston, the Rev. John H. Womack Sr. has built what was a struggling church of about 55 members when he arrived in 1993 into a growing community of more than 250. The Metropolitan Baptist Church (MBC), according to the congregation, “embodies its mission of being not just a church in the community, but a ‘community church.’”

For the first seven years of his ministry, Womack served double duty – as a businessman and a pastor. He saw this church as his mission and worked tirelessly, seven days a week for it while running his businesses at the same time. He became involved in restructuring and reviving the infrastructure of the church’s Christian life and community outreach. He has since sold his businesses, and his parishioners say that “he is at a point where rest, reflection and renewal are essential for us to continue.”

Womack and his wife, Bertha, will travel to Liberia where MBC has helped sponsor a 400-student school. They also will go to London and visit urban churches there. Then they will board an RV and head through the South to visit congregations with a proven record of being committed to community outreach. He also plans to spend some time in Florida to relax and write about his experiences.

The Rev. Joyce E. Schroer enjoys the rural life as pastor of the First Congregational Church in Berlin Heights, Ohio (pop. 1,000). She wonders, however, what makes rural churches unique and how changes in the community’s demographics will affect church growth.

Schroer and her husband, Steve, intend to find out by traveling the back roads across America’s heartland, stopping in small towns, asking questions, and talking with other rural pastors in Illinois, the Dakotas, Iowa and Nebraska.

Members report that she has “pushed them, encouraged new ideas and approaches to ministry, and made us work hard at reaching out to new people.” While they worked on the proposal for the grant, they solicited input not only from the congregation but from the townspeople as well. They say it was “challenging and fun brainstorming ideas, then putting it all together.”

As for Schroer, she says, “I love this small village and the people who live here. They have opened their hearts to me. As their pastor what can I learn that can continue to give them hope and revitalize their lives?” That will be the focus of her renewal agenda.

Out in Boise, Idaho, the Rev. Henry Carmona has spent three years at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. In that short time, his congregation says he “has made way for a truly remarkable spiritual awakening in our parish. We’ve hosted five evangelization retreats, which led to the development of small faith-sharing communities. We’ve developed an adult education/formation program and are preparing for a 30-week in-depth Bible study. We have a vibrant youth program. Because he came from a country with poverty, he has opened our eyes to the universal needs of the poor and gotten us involved to make a difference.”

Indeed, Carmona’s hometown is Cali, Colombia, and it figures largely in his renewal plans. The first thing he will do is fly “home” and reconnect with family, friends and former parishioners in his home parish of San Juan Bautista Mission in Cali, where he served from 1979 to 1990.

After that he heads to Rome for a program called “Christ Renews His Priests” and anticipates an audience with Pope Benedict XVI. He plans to study Italian and visit various other cities in Italy, Germany, France and Switzerland. He will take time for a nine-day trip to visit a sister in England whom he has not seen in nine years.

“The wealth of imagination unleashed by this program is truly wonderful to behold,” said the Endowment’s Dykstra. “We can think of no better reward for these hardworking men and women than to enable them to experience personal growth and renewal in ways that they themselves dream up and that they feel will feed them most deeply.
